Guided Reading Student Sensei Prompt Sheet.

- Have the Japanese/ English reader ready
- Hand out the Japanese readers to your group.
- Type the following URL into Google search
 - Free Audiobooks JAPANESE LANGUAGE EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES (nihongoshop.com)
- Scroll down page and find the set reader. Press play for the Japanese only version.
- Listen to first page with the group then press pause.

Discuss with group what it could mean- Ask-

- (1) Do you recognise any of the words?
- (2) Are there any other clues to help you on the page?
- (3) What do you think will happen next?
 - Turn page and share the English with the group.
 - Continue in this way for each page until the end of the story.
 - Share thoughts about the story as a group at the end-likes/dislikes/interesting new words or phrases you learned.
 - Start at the beginning of the book again and press play for the Japanese and English audio reading on the ipad. Listen and turn the pages with the reader as a group.
 - Take turns to find words in the story- write on mini-boards
 - Collect all readers and return to reader box with this prompt sheet.

Extra Fun for Fast Finishers:

Lead your group to play some of the following games:

- Are there any Katakana words in the story? If so who can say how many first? Can you translate them to English?
- Is there any kanji in the story- can you say what they are and what they mean in English?

- How many Hiragana can you find with a selected stroke order on one page?- e.g. 3 stroke Hiragana on page 17.
- Can you think of a word that you could change in Japanese and have it make sense. E.g よわい (weak) change to つよい (strong)
 -Discuss how this would alter the story.
- Hangman with chosen word from the story

• One student jumbles up a sentence from the story- Can you unjumble it before the timer runs out? E.g. れんしゅう かおしました。 こわい を which would be from p.9 (The Good Fortune Oni)

and the answer would be

こわい かお を れんしゅうしました。He practised scary faces.
